Foresight for Libraries: Peering Into the Future to Make Better Library Decisions Today



Goal: Identifying, assessing, and (perhaps) shaping the way that systems and relationships develop over time.

Aspects:

- Careful and thoughtful analysis of current conditions, pressures on the system, risks, resources, and the potential implications of current trends.
- Process reveals potential futures; it does not predict a particular future.
- Develop strategies, policies, action plans, etc., that move toward desirable futures while also avoiding undesirable futures.
- Purposeful action to increase the probability, plausibility, and feasibility of the desired futures.

Common Mistake: Conflating values and theories about how the world should be with how the world currently is, which leads to adopting strategies that have unintended consequences and inadvertently decrease the likelihood of desirable futures.



One Technique: Trend Analysis



A trend ...

- … is a tendency or direction of change over time.
- o ... can be increasing or a decreasing.
- o ... can be strong or weak.
- … can be accelerating or slowing.
- … influences but does not determine the future.

When I am asked what I learned at this workshop, I will tell them...?"



I learned that inn order to be a successful librarian you need to have the right skills, and what is expected from research librarians in the library profession. Also, the shift to open access publishing what we imagined 10 years ago is happening now.

The future librarian can be defined in many ways but more importantly, technology (AI) is always part of the explanation.

The future research librarian is ready for what is coming. We are not scared of AI!

My take away from the second presentation is connecting with user creates a bond of trust between the info seeker and the library. If a connection is made between the library and patron, patrons tend to trust and rely on the library to satisfy their access needs. This also tends to be a market strategy in a sense that users who trust the library tend to refer other user to the library, and at the end fo the day you have users automatically market your library services.

Creativity as a librarian in the present and future.

Team work – I have learnt that everything is a lot more easier when done in collaboration.

Team work among librarian is key to overcoming multiple challenges ahead. Foresight is important. There is need for future thinking and a deliberate attempt to make more connections not only for effective service delivery and research support, for also to advocate and legitimize the profession.

I learned what a future librarian should be like. I learned what is future and trends. How librarians should work.

We need to adopt as librarians, but as libraries as well, to inspire our users through their environments, resources and the skills we offer them as future librarians.
